Changes to the ACRRM PDP Program



Promoting the practice of good medicine



Continuing Professional Development (CPD) is a professional obligation for all general practitioners and is a registration requirement of the Medical Board of Australia (MBA). The MBA has proposed regulatory changes to strengthen CPD under the Professional Performance Framework (PPF), aiming to increase value and effectiveness.

A new ACRRM framework ensures access to a range of continuing educational activities to enhance clinical management and professional skills.

Activities will be measured in hours, rather than points, and members will need to achieve 150 hours throughout 2020–2022 and in subsequent trienniums.

Professional Development Program (PDP) requirements

The new framework for the ACRRM Professional Development Program (PDP) facilitates the recognition of day-to-day practice-based learning, as well as traditional educational opportunities. Requirements are the same for both full-time and part-time GPs.

Sonic Dx

Sonic Dx provides doctors with accessible data and tools to reflect on their practice and measure outcomes. Using Custom Views, data sets can be extracted for review, using patients' results for a specific condition group (for example, diabetes, CST, lipids) or those who have had specific testing.



Sonic Education online e-learning

Our new online e-learning environment allows doctors to undertake training in a flexible, self-paced manner. This can be via short seminars or videos, which are relevant to their scope of practice or areas of clinical interest.

Maintenance of Professional Standards (MOPS) reporting

The ACRRM MOPS program is an optional extra level of PDP record keeping and reporting for members who have extended skills in procedural or emergency practice. ACRRM reports on behalf of members to the appropriate bodies for MOPS purposes. Activities undertaken for MOPS will also contribute to your overall PDP requirements. Sonic Healthcare programs often are awarded MOPS points.
